

**Workshop Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Brockport was held in the Conference Room, Municipal Building, 49 State Street, Brockport, New York, Monday, June 12, 2006 at 7:00pm.**

**PRESENT:** Mayor Morton Wexler, Trustee/Vice Mayor Carrie L. Maziarz, Trustee Maria C. Castañeda, Trustee Mary Jo Nayman, Village Manager Ian M. Coyle

**ALSO PRESENT:** Approximately six members of the public.

Discussion took place on several items.

The following motion(s) were made:

Association of Monroe County Villages – Legal Counsel – Monroe County Lawsuit -

There was discussion on the lawsuit from Monroe County and the decision of the Association of Monroe County Villages to collectively defend each village entity with a single attorney, Peter Skivington, Village Attorney for the Village of Scottsville.

- ➔ Trustee Maziarz moved, Trustee Nayman seconded, unanimously carried to approve Peter Skivington, Esq to represent the Association member Villages, including the Village of Brockport, in the legal proceedings for the Monroe County lawsuit at a rate of \$175 per hour.

Main Street Flowers and Watering -

Pat Kutz was present to discuss with the Board her idea on a public/private partnership to assist in offsetting the costs of watering the hanging baskets of flowers on Main Street. P. Kutz stated she is a strong supporter of Main Street beautification efforts and thinks the flowers give a positive and welcoming message. She stated she has over \$1,000 in private donations so far, not just from merchants, and that a letter would be forthcoming that listed the names of people who donated.

Trustee

Castañeda stated she approached three separate downtown merchants and received an additional \$75 in financial support. P. Kutz also noted that Bill Andrews stated he would assist in underwriting the flower watering costs.

- ➔ Trustee Maziarz moved, Trustee Castañeda seconded, unanimously carried to purchase the hanging baskets on Main Street with Village funds with the cost of watering assisted by the generous support of the aforementioned public/private partnership.

The Village Board thanked P. Kutz for her efforts.
